Executive Summary

This Offer includes an additional \$268,912 named Admin Special Programs proposing new uses for undesignated CSF in response to the Priority Team's request for proposals redirecting Community Service Fee (CSF) funds. These dollars are targeted for 3 new County efforts: 1)Create an Ombudsman program for business(Omb). 2)Partner with MC cities in an industrial land survey. 3)Develop a comprehensive plan for assistance to small business (SB).

Program Description

The funding for Admin Special Programs funds 3 new efforts: 1)The Ombudsman/professional services effort will establish a "hot-line" proactively facilitate communication with the business community to identify and overcome impediments to doing business in MC. 2)Professional Services for an industrial land survey and marketing materials identifying undeveloped land and when it will be shovel ready. 3)Professional Services to research, develop and implement a small business support program, important because research suggests 85% of all new jobs will come from this sector. It is aniticpated this program will be best implemented through a partnership with Portland Business Alliance.

Program Justification

The Admin Special Projects: 1)Ombudsmanship program will resolve customer problems while inviting the business community to help determine actions that would make MC more business friendly. 2)Industrial Land Survey will ensure that industrial land projects stimulate jobs and new assessed value. 3)Small Business Support program will ensure the creation or retention of jobs.

Performance Measures

Admin Special Projects: Admin New Programs evaluation will be based on Thriving Economy Indicators, jobs and wages.
