Executive Summary

The Multnomah County Alternative Incarceration Program (AIP) will work with inmates on a 90-day transitional leave from the State Department of Corrections' Powder River, Coffee Creek and Summit correctional facilities. This program offer is one component of the program, which is also included in 50028B Adult Offender Housing.

Program Description

The State of Oregon has allocated approximately \$1 million to the State's 36 counties to facilitate early release of high-risk offenders from incarceration and provide a transition back into the county communities. The program will provide alcohol and drug aftercare and will be combined with an appropriate continuum of services found in other program offers, including Adult Transitional and Reentry Services and Adult Offender Housing. If this approach is successful, the State will save money because the dollars provided for the alternative to incarceration are less than the cost of prison bed-days for continued incarceration. The counties will benefit by more successful transition of offenders back into the community while providing them alternatives to further criminal activity, thereby enhancing community safety.

Program Justification

The Alternative Incarceration Program relates directly to the Safety Priority request for offers that: demonstrate a collaborative approach that benefits service delivery and/or reduces cost of service delivery without regard to which agency provides the service; provide a continuum of funding for the treatment during transition between programs or back into the community; deliver evidence based addiction treatment; demonstrate an ability to place clients into housing.
