Executive Summary

In December 2005 the City of Gresham and Multnomah County entered into an agreement to transfer the remaining roads within the corporate limits of Gresham to Gresham. This program offer allows for the payments from the County to the City to occur.

Program Description

The intergovernmental agreement prescribes an ongoing financial obligation for Multnomah County to the City for storm water upgrades, maintenance, positions and an amended payment formula for the previous 1995 road transfer agreement.

This program offer does not deliver any county services and is submitted for the provision of a supplemental payment to the City of Gresham as allowed by Oregon Budget Law.

Program Justification

This intergovernmental agreement responds to the initial findings of a study commissioned by the Board to examine options for transportation service delivery and road jurisdiction in East Multnomah County. The study recommended the transfer of County roads in Gresham to the City and identified service levels, personnel and fiscal matters to be considered. The transportation study and the 2005 state legislation session passage of Senate bill 1096 became the framework from which the agreement was developed.

The County road funds are transferred annually into Gresham's Department of Environmental Services, Transportation budget. The City co-mingles these funds into their transportation operating budget. The City prescribed allowed use of these funds are defined under ORS 366 which requires funds can only be used for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, repair, maintenance, operation and use of public highways, roads, streets and the administration thereof.

Performance Measure - Description

The County road funds are transferred quarterly into Gresham's Transportation budget. The City co-mingles these funds into their transportation operating budget. The agreement did not require the City to communicate how County funds were to be used. The City prescribed allowed use of these funds are defined under ORS 366 which requires funds can only be used for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, repair, maintenance, operation and use of public highways, roads, streets and the administration thereof.

The supplemental payment from the county to the city has increased from a \$513,362 budget plan in FY 2006, to a projected \$2,896,047 in FY 2007. This increase is a reflection of the County's associated costs in providing transportation services for the 50 miles of road transferred to the City of Gresham.
