Executive Summary

Program Offer Type:

Bienestar de La Familia (Well-being of the Family) is a multi-disciplinary team serving the Latino community in Multnomah County. The program provides culturally specific and linguistically appropriate comprehensive mental health and social services including drug and alcohol treatment and evaluation and domestic violence services.

This scaled offer represents the drug and alcohol evaluation, treatment and prevention services position to provide these essential services within the Bienestar multi-disciplinary team.

Program Description

Bienestar has an ADES (Alcohol and Drug Evaluation Services) position at the Ortiz Center providing assessment, treatment, outreach and groups to youth and adults as well as women's groups for domestic violence issues related to alcohol and drug issues. The ADES works closely with the mental health consultants in the Bienestar program to ensure individual's alcohol and drug treatment issues are addressed in a coordinated way. The ADES also works closely with the health professionals in La Clinica da Salud to ensure access and coordination. Historically, Latinos have limited access to services with qualified service providers. Prevention and reducing disparities in access to alcohol and drug services are included in Bienestar goals.

Program Justification

Bienestar clearly supports the priorities identified by the Basic Living Needs Outcome Team. Bienestar receives referrals from health clinics, schools, Head Start programs, other mental health and social service providers, self-referrals of clients, and law enforcement. The multi-disciplinary team (this offer describes only the mental health aspect of the Bienestar team, which also includes staff from the DSCP) works collaboratively with other agencies and Hispanic providers in the community to provide appropriate and coordinated care for the Hispanic client and family unable to access traditional services, thus reducing health and service disparities. It provides services in a variety of settings, often in the home of the client when this is the only way in which the client can access those services. The program links closely with the School Aged Policy and Early Childhood Frameworks.
