Executive Summary

The Waitlist Reduction Program provides Intensive Case Management (ICM) for patients transitioning from acute care and the State Hospital to the community, facilitating prevention of re-hospitalization. The Waitlist Reduction Program funds four Emergency Liasons with Project Respond who provide for diversion of patients from acute care hospitalization, decreasing County expenditures and increasing patient independence. ICM served 85 clients and Emergency Liasons diverted 158 consumers from hospitalization in FY05-06.

Program Description

The Waitlist Reduction Program provides funding for Intensive Case Management (ICM) for patients discharging from the State Hospital, Telecare Recovery Center and local acute care, psychiatric hospitals. ICM staff provide resources and assistance in obtaining housing, access to health care, social services and outpatient mental health services. The Waitlist Reduction Program also provides funding for four Emergency Liason Staff with Project Respond to assist with safe diversion from Acute Care Hospital Emergency Departments. Both program components decrease use of limited crisis and inpatient psychiatric resources and increase client independence. Emergency Liason staff reduce the number of indigent individuals placed Emergency Psychiatric Holds, reducing cost to the County. All staff facilitate the education and involvement of family and caregivers.

Program Justification

All elements of this program link to the Basic Living Needs priority, the Poverty Elimination Framework and 10-Year Plan to End Homelessness, by ensuring Intervention and Service Coordination in the provision of housing and comprehensive community supports and services, by providing direct connection to stable, affordable housing and adequate, appropriate crisis services to stabilize consumers quickly. Emergency Liasons decrease unnecessary hospitalization of mentally ill clients in limited, acute care hospital, psychiatric beds, effectively decreasing the financial responsibility of the County as payor of last resort for the indigent. There are links to the Safety Team priority by providing for client and community safety through staff monitoring of client's mental and physical health.
