#### **Executive Summary**

This program places two mental health consultants in Community Court to assist the court with defendants who have mental health & addictions issues. They meet daily with defendants to assess any social service and crisis intervention needs the defendants may have. They then make a recommendation to the Court which is incorporated into the court order. They refer defendants to appropriate treatment and other services, monitor the defendant in treatment and report back to the court. Their presence allows the County to have a de facto 'Mental Health' court, and greatly increases the likelihood of defendants successfully completing their community court service requirements.

#### **Program Description**

Two mental health consultants work directly in the courtroom, interacting with the Judge and defendants. Many community court defendants cycle through the courts on a regular basis. Their chronicity is fueled by homelessness, mental illness and addictions. The mental health consultants conduct screenings and assessments and use the results to make recommendations to the court for ordered treatment services. They make referrals for the defendants to treatment and other services, and assist them in entering into programs. They monitor their progress in treatment and report back to the courts. They provide case summaries to the court when defendants complete court ordered services.

#### **Program Justification**

This program links to the Basic Needs Priority by assuring access to basic health services (addiction and mental health services) for chronically homeless, addicted citizens of Multnomah County. The clients are often high utilizers of county and city services in our jails and hospitals, as well as the courts. The services of the mental health consultants can assist in clients moving from chronic conditions toward a less vulnerable, more self-sufficient state. This program promotes healthy behaviors by addressing unmet mental health needs and the use of drugs and alcohol. The program ties to the 10-year Plan to End Homelessness, as many of the clients are chronically homeless individuals.
