Executive Summary

This new pilot program supplements existing prevention services by providing the parents of 60 high-risk children with intensive, comprehensive economic opportunity services. These 60 families receive intensive supports including mentoring and family engagement through a collaborative prevention program at eight public housing sites. The goal of this pilot is to increase the families' incomes 25% within 3 years. This will improve outcomes for the children and parents in these families and help move them toward self-sufficiency and out of publicly funded housing.

Program Description

This proposed program would provide a comprehensive mix of training, employment, and supportive services for economic independence somewhat similar to the Workforce and Housing Project currently implemented through the Portland Economic Opportunity Initiative by SE Works. This program would be procured competitively by Portland Bureau of Housing and Community Development on behalf of the Portland Economic Opportunity Initiative and would serve residents who live at eight HAP sites throughout Multnomah County. The Portland Economic Opportunity Initiative funds over 30 small economic support programs that provide services to help focused groups of low-income families increase their incomes 25% within 3 years. This collaborative program includes City of Portland Economic Opportunity Initiative, Northwest Area Foundation, United Way and Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Program Justification

This program supports Basic Needs strategy 6 by helping increase family income and self-sufficiency of high-risk families that we serve. It links to the school aged policy framework by improving the economic functioning of families of school-aged children. Poverty is a key risk factor for multiple problem outcomes including youth substance abuse. This program adds a proverty elimination component to the successful Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) collaborative prevention program already serving 60 high-risk families at eight HAP sites throughout the County. It provides intensive economic development services to other family supports with the goal of improving family functioning and developing self-sufficiency that will improve outcomes for the families while at the same time increasing movement of families out of HAP sites into privately funded housing, thus increasing the effective capacity of the HAP programs. This pilot improves the linkage between prevention and the poverty elimination high level outcomes of the Basic Needs priority area. The 30 economic opportunity programs already funded in this collaborative effort have a strong record of success in improving client income through intensive supports.
