Executive Summary

The passage of the November 2006 library levy provides funding for operational costs for a new library in Troutdale, beginning January 2009. This offer would fund the siting process, the construction of tenant improvements in a leased space, and the opening day collection for this new neighborhood library over the next 18 months.

Program Description

This offer is based on siting this new, leased neighborhood library in a visible, easily accessible location, near public transportation. The new neighborhood library would be open 53 hours per week, serving a population of about 30,000 people and offering 200 story times and other programs per year (in English and Spanish). Because of its large Hispanic/Latino population, the collection will include books and other library materials in English and Spanish, and some staff will be bilingual. The branch will have a meeting room for library programs and community meetings, offering a welcoming place for neighbors to interact and engage in community forums. Funding for this offer includes money for siting, constructing tenant improvements, purchasing computers and peripherals, and building the opening day collection.

Program Justification

Livability, in part due to a sense of community and place, can be achieved by a neighborhood library, open to all, where residents choose to come together in positive interaction with one another. According to the 2000 Census, East Multnomah County (east of 122nd Avenue) is home to 210,000 residents, and currently served by just four neighborhood libraries. The area of Multnomah County west of 122nd Avenue, home to 450,000 residents, is currently served by 12 neighborhood libraries. East County, the fastest growing area in the County, is less well served by Multnomah County Library than other areas of the County. A new library in Troutdale was included in the library levy passed by voters in November 2006. A library serves as a meeting place, promoting interaction among neighbors; providing books and other materials, story times and other programs for people of all ages; and offering space for public meetings. A neighborhood library focuses on strategies #2, 3 & 4 of the Vibrant Community priority, providing opportunities for people to connect & interact, promoting a lifetime of learning, and providing a variety of cultural and recreational opportunities to help achieve a vibrant sense of community.
